

Agree on or with?

Note the significantly greater number of 'agree with' over 'agree on.'

It seems that 'agree on' is used when there is a joint decision or conclusion; the object seems to be things for accomplishing sth.

It seems that 'agree with' is used very often together with opinion (not a proposal or decision to do something) or — most often — the bearer of an opinion.

The two expressions cannot be used interchangeably.

AGREE ON

- The best that can be hoped is that the Senate and the House will agree on amendments to the law which will remove the gimmicks and inject more discipline into the process.
- It appears that policemen and women the world over have similar views about their job and agree on what aspects of police work they like and dislike.
- These two groups agree on rejecting many economic policy prescriptions of the “wets”; but disagree on the role of the state.
- Something of the sort had been attempted by the late Victorian youth organizations, but these had been unable to reach the mass teen-age population; and had also failed to agree on a coherent programme attractive to the different reforming interests.
- Mr A and Miss Z find it difficult to agree on anything — especially love and romance.
- But Speywood's position as a fully-equal partner in this venture is now at risk, because Heath, and his company's backers could not agree on a long-term strategy for the company.
- Whatever the theories, scientists and campaigners agree on one thing; that, if the means of reducing air pollution are available then it should be done.
- They will have to agree on some type of standard.
- Many couples find a good way to avoid impulsive spending is to agree on a limit of, say £5 or £10 as all that can be spent without consulting the other partner.
- Failure to agree on the basic principles of caring for refugee children started a running battle between liberal and orthodox exponents of Judaism which lasted throughout the war and beyond.
- Joint control is found where the parent companies must agree on decisions concerning the joint venture company.
- One thing most leasing companies agree on is that asset collateral is no longer sufficient to lend against.
- The problem is that they do not agree on the facts surrounding this event.
- remier John Major is prepared to lead an unprecedented series of bruising encounters at Number 10 to allow warring departments to agree on where the Treasury axe will fall.
- The best thing about A Feminist Dictionary, I think, is its overt acknowledgement that speakers do not agree on what words mean, and that sometimes this is an important matter of political debate.
- For many, “law” and “order” refer to the ideal of legality (or “the rule of law”) — and while it is clear that this does not refer to an uncontroversial notion, it is arguable that most people would agree on certain core features of the rule of law: a congruence of official action with a previously declared rule so as to preserve individual autonomy and freedom from arbitrary state power, and a notion of equal treatment of individuals in the eye of the law.
- Blum therefore felt obliged to go back on his original commitment to aid Spanish democracy, and instead proposed that the main European powers agree on a policy of “non-intervention” in Spain.
